About the role:

Are you passionate about videography and looking for a meaningful way to use your skills? Blood Cancer UK is seeking talented and enthusiastic volunteer videographers to help capture our events and community activities across the UK.

Your videos will play a vital role in promoting our work, engaging supporters, and raising awareness of blood cancer. By capturing a diverse range of images of all participants at our events, we can inspire future registrations and encourage more people to get involved.

Key activities:

As a Volunteer Videographer, you will:

- Film high-quality footage for use on our website, social media, and in both internal and external communications (copyright of all content will belong to Blood Cancer UK).
- Engage with the family and friends of runners at our cheer points to create a supportive and lively atmosphere.
- Capture staff, volunteers, event participants, and our blood cancer community at organised events.
- Work to a creative brief, capturing candid and posed moments at events, fundraising activities, and community initiatives.
- Edit footage using video editing software, including tasks such as trimming, colour correction, and audio enhancement.
- Liaise with the Events, Fundraising, and Marketing teams to ensure videos align with our brand.
- Work alongside the Blood Cancer UK team to obtain consent when filming individuals.

About you – what skills, experience and qualities will you need for the role?:

We welcome videographers of all experience levels! Ideal candidates will have:

- Access to a high-quality video camera.
- Their own video equipment and editing software.
- Confidence in using a video camera competently.
- Experience filming content for social media.
- The ability to follow a brief and work independently.
- A keen eye for detail and storytelling through video.
- Strong interpersonal skills and the ability to work with diverse audiences, including children.
- Confidence in working independently and taking initiative.
- A well-organised and reliable approach.

How much time will you need to give?:

This flexible, ad-hoc role involves occasional on-site support at events or in the office. You can choose opportunities that fit your availability, with some events requiring 3–4 hours onsite and extra time for editing.

This role is a mix of home-based and on-location work, depending on where our events and activities take place. We're currently looking for volunteers in London, Birmingham, and Edinburgh.
